In our nursery class, our goal is to create a peaceful atmosphere and care for your child's physical needs to give them a great first impression of their Heavenly Father. We encourage you to convey any information that would help us better care for your child.

Top 5 Things You Need to Know

1 The Service Experience

During service, your child will have plenty of interaction, play time, and a lesson built around their developmental needs. Our nursery lessons focus on teaching your child that God loves them, made them, and cares for them.

2 What to Bring

One of our nursery volunteers will make sure that all your child's belongings are correctly labeled and stored safely in the classroom! You may bring a diaper bag, extra diaper and a pacifier for your child, but due to known and unknown allergies, we ask that no food enter the classroom and drinks be limited to bottles or sippy cups containing formula, cow's milk, mother's milk, or water only.

3 Crying Doesn't Bother Us At All!

Don't be alarmed if your child cries at drop-off and pick-up. We understand this is a natural and healthy sign that your child has formed a bond with you. This usually begins in the early months and can continue into the preschool years. Kids with different temperaments will react differently to separation anxiety, so there is no need to feel alarmed if you see other children waving "bye-bye" and going off to play. They may have a different way of soothing than your little one does. Our volunteers are trained to care for your child patiently; however, if we are unable to console them, we will text you.

4 Nursing Mother's Area

The nursing mother's area is an option available for all moms who need to nurse their child during service. For the comfort of all of our moms, we ask that this area stay reserved for moms and nursing babies only. Feel free to ask any nursery volunteer for directions to this space.

5 Wellness

We care about the health of your child and the other kids too! Therefore, we ask that all kids who are experiencing a fever of 99.8 or above, vomiting, or have started taking an antibiotic within the last 24 hours not come to class on that day. Additionally, we thoroughly clean and disinfect all classroom items regularly.
